

We have a few volunteer shifts available on weekends, but these are available by approval only. Thank you for supporting our VBS with your time and talent!

If you have a special talent or would like to lead a group or center all 5 days, please make note of that on your registration form. We greatly appreciate the super volunteers that donate 5 full mornings of time! While this might seem like a daunting responsibility, we find that the volunteers enjoy having the full VBS experience as much as the children. Please let us know if you can answer the call to volunteer more than 2 days.
