#### **Rector's Letter**

Dear Friends,

The Season of Lent begins with Ash Wednesday on February 14. Among the many spiritual practices to engage with during Lent, I'd like to invite you to consider some of the following possibilities that will be offered at Church.

On the Wednesdays of Lent, beginning on February 21, at noon and 7:00 p.m., we will gather for Eucharist/Bible Study in the Chapel. We offered this during Advent and so many of those who attended suggested we do this during Lent. We have set up a prayerful area in the Chapel with chairs set in a semi-circle around a simple small altar, with an icon. The service includes a brief introduction to each of the scripture readings by the priest, followed by conversation after the Gospel among those present. This is then followed by Eucharist.

On Tuesday evenings of Lent, beginning the eve of Ash Wednesday on February 13, at 7:00 p.m. in the youth wing, you are invited to learn more about the Episcopal Church. I particularly want to invite those adults who are discerning a decision to be confirmed or received into the Episcopal Church. But anyone is welcomed to attend. A six session Inquirers' Class will consist of the following listed by topic, date and presenter:

- 1. February 13- History of the Episcopal Church: Javier
- 2. February 20- Scripture: George.
- 3. February 27- The Book of Common Prayer: Javier
- 4. March 6- Sacraments: Carr
- 5. March 13- Church Polity: George
- 6. March 20- Moral Action: Carr

The Sunday Adult Formation Sessions at 10:15 a.m. during Lent will consist of a theme of having better conversation about Christianity and politics. At the writing of this article the final schedule is still being finalized, but will kick off on Sunday, February 18 with a guest speaker, Dr. Luke Bretherton, Professor of Ethics at Duke University. The title of Dr. Bretherton's presentation will be "Healing Babylon: Faithful Politics in a Time of Division." Dr. Bretherton has been the facilitator of two Diocese of North Carolina clergy conferences, and I highly recommend you not miss his presentation. Please look to the parish website and Sunday bulletin for the complete Sunday Adult Formation Schedule and topics.

Another spiritual practice I'd like to suggest is weekly Eucharist. If it is not your practice to be at church each Sunday for Eucharist perhaps make that something to consider for Lent. It may be a source of renewal for you.

2018 is here! Before I write another word. I want to thank Sherri Hubbard for her leadership as Senior Warden in 2017. The parish was blessed to have her thoughtful and dedicated leadership last year. I also want to thank our outgoing vestry members, and welcome our new vestry members. 2017 was challenging on a number of levels, particularly property and facilities. As Junior Warden, I dealt with these issues on a monthly basis. It seemed as if something was either breaking or needed replacement on a weekly basis! And fix and repair and replace and added, we did. The highlight for me was the new lighting in the courtyard, Kids' Club and Memorial Garden. It has created a much safer environment at night. We have a new ice machine in the kitchen, new coffee pots, lawn mower, toilets, new or repaired HVAC, banners in the sanctuary. We took some trees down, took down the light pole in the courtyard, and improved the playground. Lobster Fest 2017 set a new proceeds record which will be dispersed by the Men's Group, In-Reach, and Outreach efforts. ASP sent the largest contingent of St. Paul's high school students and adult sponsors out into the field to date.

2018 will be another challenging year as we continue to grow and maintain/improve the campus. Planning is underway for our new capital campaign, and we are also celebrating the church's 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary with a celebration currently scheduled for Sunday, September 16, 2018.

Pledging for 2018 is continuing, and I ask everyone reading this letter to prayerfully consider pledging if you have not already done so. The vestry retreat is scheduled for January 26-27, and we would like to finalize the budget at that time. The parish quarterly update meeting was Sunday January 28 (between the 9:00 and 11:15 a.m. services). I hope you came to learn about the budget update and to hear the latest news about the capital campaign.

The endowment program continues to grow. If you have estate plans underway, or a planned gift of some kind, please consider a gift to the St. Paul's Endowment Fund.

Thank you for all that you do for St. Paul's.


#### Women's Study Group

EYC gathers on Sunday nights for fellowship and fun activities from 5-7 p.m. with a shared meal at 6:30 p.m. We combine lots of zaniness – games, songs, lots of action – with worship and service. Our mission is to develop a spiritually rich community of young people through our programming and the presence of faith-filled adults. It's organized chaos, but it works!



















#### **Confirmation Classes for Youth**

Confirmation is an opportunity for youth to make a personal decision and recommitment to the promises that were made for them at their baptism. Someone spoke for them when they were baptized, since they were so young. But now in the sacrament of confirmation the youth can make a mature decision themselves. Confirmation preparation will consist of six sessions held during the Sunday morning education hour beginning with an orientation session (parents and youth) on Sunday, February 4 and classes starting Sunday, February 11 and running through March 18. Classes will meet at the Curry Center. At this time, we do not have a date for the Bishop's visitation when the sacrament of confirmation will take place. Stay tuned for that date. The classes are offered to teenagers who are at least in the 9th grade and who have not yet been confirmed. The only prerequisite is baptism. Toilet Paper Collection News

Just as a reminder, St. Paul's has signed up for half a shelf of toilet paper for the Dorcas Food Pantry which equates to 200 rolls a month (or 2,400 a year). As of the end of 2017, we collected 3,219 rolls of toilet paper and 12 boxes of Kleenex for the Dorcas Food Pantry. So far for 2018 we've collected 118 rolls. Thank you for supporting this effort. Our normal collection is the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of each month but you can donate any time since we have a permanent collection box located in the hallway outside the choir room.

Scheduling for Outreach appointments 9 a.m. - 12 p.m., various days; and

Dorcas Thrift Shop helpers: 2 – 6 p.m. (areas vary from day-to-day, but most common is pricing, sorting, cashiering, crafts, and books).

Individuals wishing to volunteer should fill out the Online Volunteer Form or pick one up in the Dorcas Thrift Shop or from Nancy Fierke. Once an application is received, a meeting will be scheduled with you and Ellen Frazier the Marketing and Volunteer Manager to match your schedule and interests with the volunteer slots available. A regularly scheduled commitment of about 3 hours per week is desirable but more hours are even better (for example: every Sat from

9 to noon or every Tues from 3 to 6).

## St. Paul's donates over \$6700 to Heifer International in 2017

A big "Thank You" to everyone who donated to Heifer International in 2017. St. Paul's total donation for the calendar year was \$6790.92, surpassing the parish's 2016 donation of \$6317. This wonderful contribution will purchase an entire "Gift Ark" of animals, and many more besides. The \$5000 Gift Ark provides pairs of livestock – including cows, sheep, goats, oxen, water buffalo, camels, llamas, donkeys, pigs, and beehives – to needy families around the world, along with education and training. These gifts promote sustainable farming, reliable incomes, and good nutrition. 
