Andrea Johnson:

- What do you like best about St. Paul's?
 - What I like best about St. Paul's is that we foster a deep sense of belonging and spiritual growth,
 I like being a part of this church community. I love how welcoming we are to newcomers whether they are just curious or are looking for a church home.
- What are some of your current and past parish ministry involvement and leadership positions at St. Paul's?

- What are some of your past ministry involvement and leadership positions at your former church or parish?

- What are some of your past ministry involvement and leadership positions at your former church or parish?
 - I grew up in Robbinsville, NC in the Appalachians and attended Grace Mountainside, a combined Episcopal – Lutheran church. At Grace Mountainside, I served as an Acolyte, on the altar guild, as a lector reader, and on various service projects.
- What would you most like to see accomplished during your three years of service on the vestry?
 - Continue the mission and supporting ministries that have been created at St. Paul's.
 - Nurture our culture of inclusion and kindness with opportunities for each person to be involved 'a little or a lot'.
 - Keep our "eyes on Christ" as we navigate the discernment and search process.

- What do you like best about St. Paul's?

I have volunteered for Lobster Fest since it began. I initiated and led a dinner group. I volunteered with Migrant Farm Worker Ministry, the Bread Ministry, and helped with Care and Share providing meals for church members. I designed, planned, organized, and coordinated the building of the Willa Mary Cowper Memorial Playground. I was an usher for many years. I am a member of the Refuge for Refugees Ministry and the Transportation Ministry. I participate in the disaster relief programs. I have been in Foyer groups and am a participant in Adult Formation.
- What are some of your past ministry involvement and leadership positions at your former church or parish?
 - I was a Youth Group leader volunteer and a member of the choir at Trinity Episcopal Church, Manassas, VA. I was a member of the Gourmet Dinner Group which started with twelve couples and had thirty-six couples when we left. At the Episcopal Church of the Resurrection in Starkville, MS, I was a member of the choir and the maintenance leader of the swimming pool. I was also on the yard and grounds maintenance committee there.
- What would you most like to see accomplished during your three years of service on the Vestry?
 - I want to see that the youth and children's programs continue to grow as we continue to expand opportunities for our young people. I want to see that our church family continues to grow and that more community-building opportunities are available. I want to see that the "All Are Welcome" vision continues to grow and excite visitors. I want to see that our outreach programs continue to grow and prosper. I want to see that our young adult programs grow and have more opportunities. I want to assist in selecting our next priest so that he/she will match our church vision to lead us in our next step of opportunities and growth.
